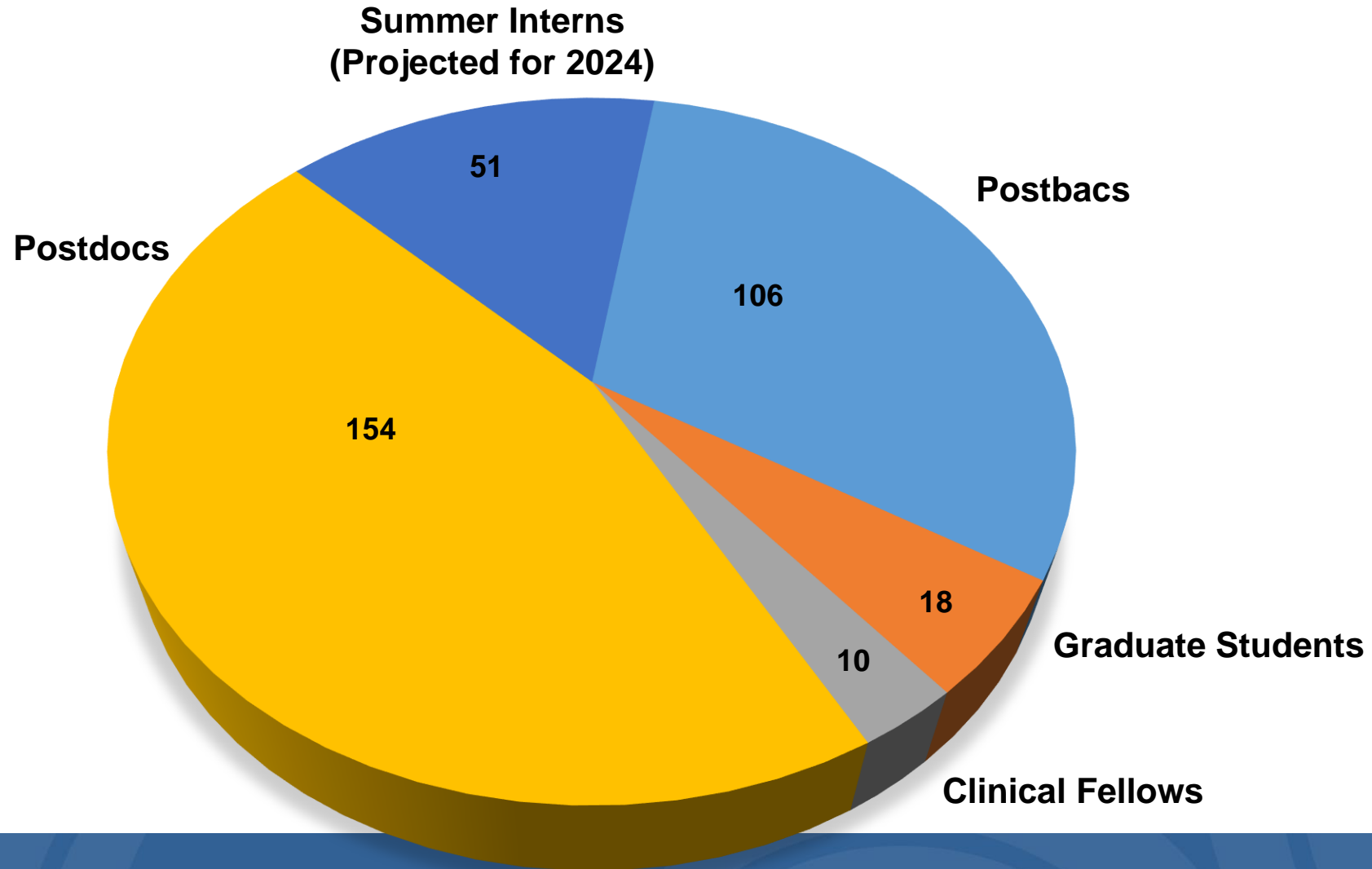

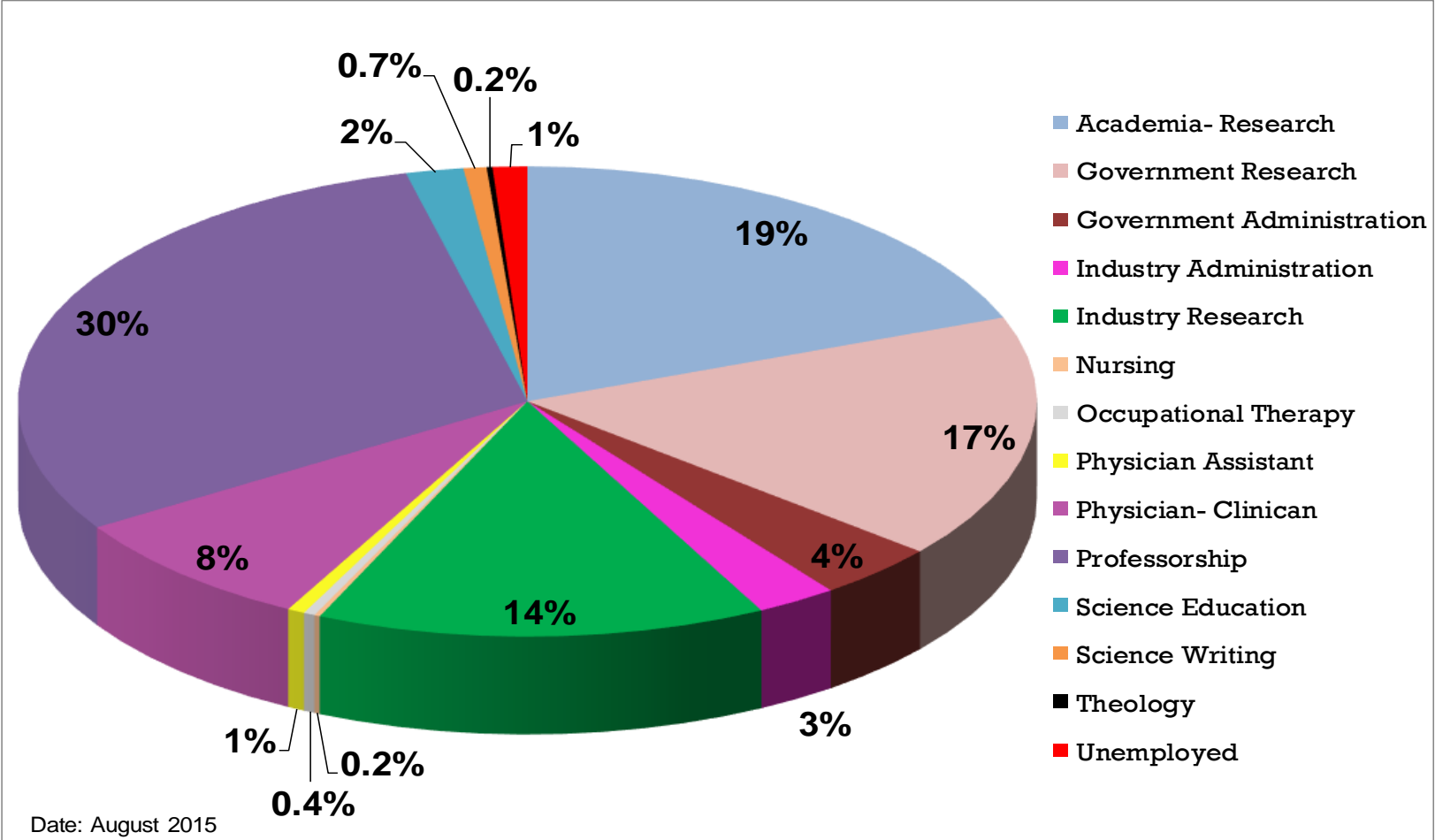

2024 Virtual Three-minute Talks (TmT)

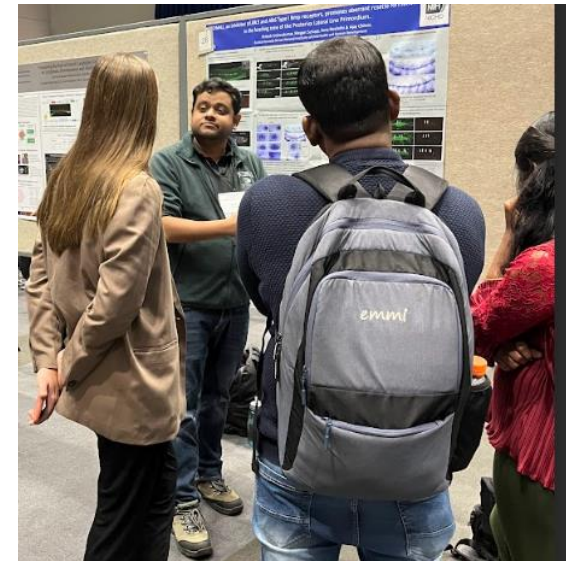
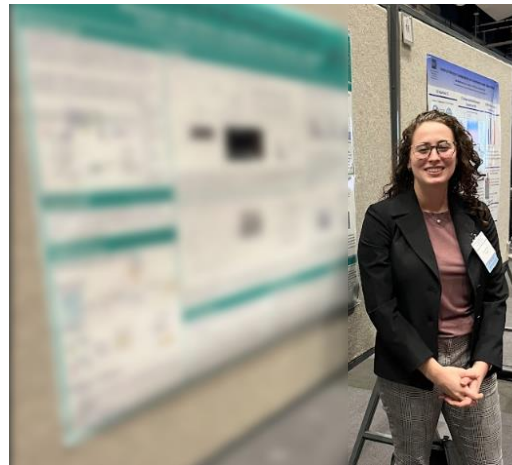
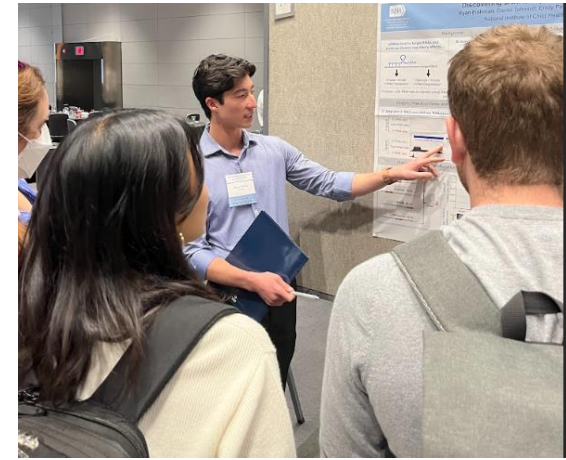
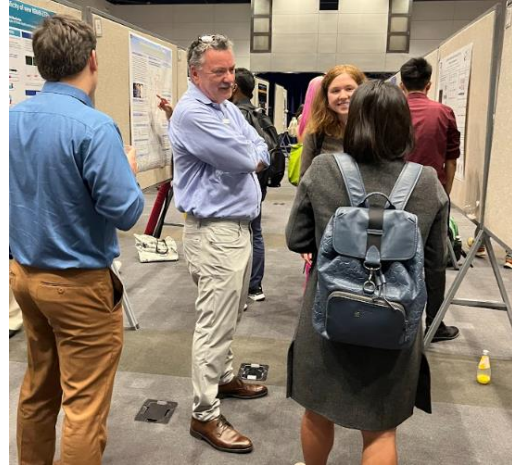
- Presenters had to convey the excitement and significance of their research projects in three minutes or less, **using just one PowerPoint slide as a visual aid.**

Being Mentored and Mentoring Others

- **Mentoring Postbac Trainees**
 - Discuss with your mentor
 - Opportunity to train a postbac for up to two years
 - Postbac Poster Day (May)
- **Mentoring Summer Trainees**
 - Apply to mentor a summer intern (December)
 - Attend training sessions (May-June)
 - Summer Poster Day (August)
- **Mentor of the Year Awards**
 - Nominations accepted annually in June and July
